## Not Just the Same Old Book Cover

**Approximate \$ Savings:** \$4 each

## Buy School Supplies in Threes

**Approximate \$ Savings:** \$50 per year

One strategy I use when buying back to school stationery and supplies is to always buy in threes. ## Keeping the Records Straight
